





Free Software Definition

"Free software" means software that respects users' freedom and community. Roughly, it means that the users have the freedom to run, copy, distribute, study, change and improve the software. Thus, "free software" is a matter of liberty, not price. **To understand the concept, you should think of "free" as in "free speech," not as in "free beer".** We sometimes call it "libre software," borrowing the French or Spanish word for "free" as in freedom, to show we do not mean the software is gratis.

GPL as a competitive advantage

"Proprietary software developers have the advantage of money; free software developers need to make advantages for each other. Using the ordinary GPL for a library gives free software developers an advantage over proprietary developers: a library that they can use, while proprietary developers cannot use it."

"Using the ordinary GPL is not advantageous for every library. There are reasons that can make it better to use the Lesser GPL in certain cases. The most common case is when a free library's features are readily available for proprietary software through other libraries."

"Free" vs. Open Source

"The terms "free software" and "open source" stand for almost the same range of programs. However, they say deeply different things about those programs, based on different values. The free software movement campaigns for freedom for the users of computing; it is a movement for freedom and justice. By contrast, the open source idea values mainly practical advantage and does not campaign for principles. This is why we do not agree with open source, and do not use that term."



Maintainer Obligations

"There's no such thing as giving away software for free. Once you have users, time-consuming requests are inevitable. I've spent about 6 hours per week for the last 9 years just responding to requests about software I shared for free."

Maintainer Obligations (2)

License Limitations

"These open source projects enable any company to utilize this software on-premises or in the cloud, and build services around it."

"AWS has not copied anybody's software or services. A number of maintainers of open source projects build commercial companies around the open source project. A small set of outliers see it as a zero-sum game and want to be the only ones able to freely monetize managed services around these open source projects."
